

Set Consciousness and the Contra Buzz

What is "consciousness" doing in our newsletter? I propose that *set consciousness* is one of the several factors that contribute to the contra dance experience.

We dance with several people during a dance. During just one time through, we dance with our partner. We dance with our neighbor. We dance with our partner's neighbor. We might dance with the previous neighbor, or the next neighbor, or both, or with our shadow/trail buddy.

Ultimately, we dance with the entire set. Set consciousness means being aware of this fact. And when enough members of a set are set-conscious, the set itself becomes (hang on!) a conscious entity, and certain somewhat mundane phenomena might occur:

- As the set forms, it spaces itself out and orients itself in relation to the other sets and the hall.
- Long lines go forward and back together.
- The set adjusts itself during the dance. When dancing on a nonlevel surface, such as the Oak Park dance platform, the set uses every opportunity to move itself back to where it started, without the caller having to specifically call figures such as "long lines forward and stretch."
- The individual dancers, while enjoying and expressing themselves, take the needs of the set into account.

So far this might sound like a chore, but the real, not-so-mundane phenomenon is the extraordinary feeling that comes to a group that is see SETS, next page


Put a Little Step in Your Spring

You Can, You Will, You Must!



Contra Dance Resources on the Internet

If you thought TV was a waste of time, you haven't met the Internet. But at least the Internet has some resources related to contra dance, and here's a partial list.

Usenet: the rec.folk-dancing newsgroup includes discussions about various kinds of folk dance, including contra dance. The SBCDS calendar is posted there on a quarterly basis. Locally, the tri.dance newsgroup is intended to include postings about performance and recreational dance in the tri-counties. At this point, SBCDS, Ojai and SLO contra dance information appears there but not much else.

Mailing lists: the rec.folk-dancing newsgroup is also available via e-mail for those without Usenet access. Send subscription requests to tjw+@pitt.edu (Terry J. Wood) and ask to be put on the Folk Dance Mailing List (FDML).

Another mailing list, focusing on contra dancing throughout the state, is available by sending an e-mail message to mailserv@pitzer.edu. The body of the message should contain: subscribe cadance-coop-l. No subject is required. This mailing list includes a comprehensive weekly dance schedule for the entire state plus advance notice of special events.

E-mail: messages to the SBCDS can be sent to cannon@alumni.caltech.edu.

The SBCDS is an affiliate of the Country Dance and Song Society. Their address is 71231.2526@compuserve.com.

World-Wide Web: you could start with the (unofficial) SBCDS home page, <URL: http://www.rain.org/~gshapiro/ sbcds/>, and explore the links from there.
